Amy joined us in Lospalos for 12 months as a Australian Youth Ambassador for Development, working as a Youth Arts Mentor at the Centre for Traditional and Contemporary Art and Culture. Merging her professional background in international development and visual arts, Amy has developed creative programs for young asylum seekers in detention and indigenous youth from remote Australian communities. She has also spent several years engaged with Timor-Leste through research, field study and her role as co-manager of the Matadalan Ba Malu Scholarship Program at RMIT. Since arriving in Lospalos in late October, Amy has met with a number of young people in the district who she describes as being "incredibly enthusiastic and eager to engage in creative arts, as well as naturally talented and interested in both customary and contemporary creative practices." She is looking forward to working with the Many Hands team and creating new opportunities for young people in the Lautem district to positively engage with creative arts and cultural development within their home community.



MHI also congratulates AVID volunteer Lucia Pichler for her good cheer and fortitude and her marvellous contribution since March 2013. Lucia lived as the only Australian and one of very few foreigners in the remote town of Lospalos until she was joined by Amy in October.

Smart Schoolies week in Timor-Leste

As we have heard in the news recently, every year more than 500 young Australians are hospitalized from alcohol related incidents in the unhappy Australian ritual of alcohol-fueled post-school celebration. In an innovative project trialled this month, MHI is working to promote a "Smart Schoolies" cultural alternative. Students from Rosebud Secondary College, in the Mornington Peninsula Shire in Victoria (Australia), visited their municipality's 'friendship town' Lospalos (Timor-Leste) to pioneer an alternative version of Schoolies Week. While in Lospalos, the students celebrated the final realisation of their right to secondary school education while having a meaningful volunteering experience.

Progress report on Lautem Cultural Centre, Stage One.

The building works on our major project, the Centre for Traditional and Contemporary Arts and Culture in Lospalos, move closer and closer to completion. After a slow final leg, the last tasks in the building of Stage One are expected to be complete on December 24th; a nice Christmas treat for us after five years of working towards this goal!

The site of the new cultural centre is a former Portuguese market place that had been partly renovated and then abandoned. Located in the centre of Lospalos, it is perfectly positioned as a community cultural hub. After much negotiation and collaboration with all levels of government in Timor-Leste, as well as with significant volunteer input from generous Australians, \$250,000 from the Government of Timor-Leste and hard yakka from the team at Community Housing Limited, a beautiful new community facility is just about ready.

We are looking forward to the official opening in early 2014.

Staff contribute to UNESCO Workshop for the Implementation of Intangible Cultural Heritage

During November, MHI staff Justino Valentim and Nelinha Pereira participated in a UNESCO Workshop for the Implementation of Intangible Cultural Heritage, in Jakarta, Indonesia. The two other participants from Timor-Leste were staff from the Secretariat of State for Art and Culture, Government of Timor Leste. Justino and Nelinha gave a presentation on the activities of MHI and in particular on our Fataluku Endangered Cultural Heritage Project. They learnt about implementation of the UNESCO Convention 2003 and methods for recording, identifying threats and risks, and safeguarding Intangible Cultural Heritage. Through projects like the audio visual recordings, undertaken as part of the Fataluku Project, MHI contributes to the strengthening of endangered intangible cultural heritage



practices, as identified in the Convention.

MHI staff were supported to attend the workshop by the office of UNESCO, Jakarta.

Workshop: Stress Management, Dili, November 2013.

This month MHI partnered with Professor John Toumbourou of Deakin University and Drs. Ruth and John Rudge of Southern Cross Clinical Psychology Services, Darwin, to present a workshop on stress management for health professionals in Dili. This topic had been suggested at a prior meeting of health professionals in Timor-Leste who experience significant pressures in managing their stressful working lives as well as demands at home. Many of the participants discussed their very challenging work dealing with clients experiencing the impact of previous and current traumas, compounded by their underdeveloped skills and inadequate workplace support.
